October 17 and October 24, 2010

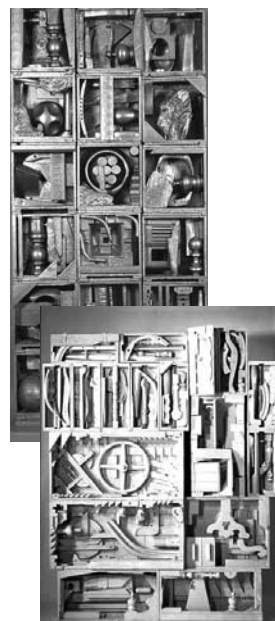
